A massive geothermal steam separator leaves the yard at Robt. Stone Engineering in New Plymouth yesterday. The 74-tonne separator was being trucked to Bell Block to be painted. Its final destination is Kawerau. The separator is one of several vessels built by the engineering company for a new geothermal power station in the Bay of Plenty town. Project manager Ros Eden says it is the world's second largest geothermal separator. He says the trip to Kawerau will take three days, with the truck going via Marton to avoid the tunnels on the road north.
